FOR A MOOSE, IS SHOT DEAD

Neither Holland or Gilchrist had been held by the authorities in connection with the case, both having offered to give themselves up already should it be necessary. It is not yet known whether legal action will be taken.

The coroner's jury is made up of A. F. Bentley, foreman; R. E. McLeod, John H. Bradshaw, W. B. Bentley, John Mc-Intyre, Wesley Brittain and John Howard. George E. Mosher was the constable.


