Read and received Extract Minutes of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, dated May 30, 1860, and signed W. Suodgrass, Clerk of Synod; bearing that in accordance with the Report of their Committee on the celebration of the Tri-centenary of the Scottish Reformation, they recommended all the Ministers of that Church to direct the attention of their people to the character and results of the Scottish Reformation, by appropriate discourses, on the 16th day of December next, the Sabbath next preceding the day on which the first General Assembly was held in Edinburgh; and that their Clerk be instructed to communicate this recommendation to the Moderators of the other Presbyterian Synods in this Province, with the expression of the desire of that Synod, that they also include a like arrangement in their mode of celebration.

The Clerk was instructed to communicate with Mr. Suodgrass, and to state, for the information of the Church of Scotland Synod, that action has already been taken by this Synod, in accordance with their recommendation.

Dr. Ferrier, seconded by Mr. Coutts moved, that the next meeting be held in Dr. Taylor's Church, in the City of Toronto.

Mr. Aitken moved, seconded by Dr. William Taylor, that the next meeting be held in Dr. Taylor's Church, in the City of Montreal.

A vote was first taken between Montreal and Toronto, when 48 voted for Montreal and 18 for Toronto. Another vote was taken between Montreal and London, when 43 voted for Montreal and 28 for London.
