THE CONFESSION OF FAITH. Opinions of Ministers About it and the Question of its Revision.

The discussion about the revision of Westminster Confession of Faith and the views of our own Presbyterians in relation to it were discussed in a meeting of the Synod of Nova Scotia held at St. John's on Monday evening last.

"What do you think of the Confession of Faith?" "I think it is a grand old scriptural creed, a creed which is correctly embodied in the system of doctrine taught in the scriptures than any other merely human symbol."

"I regard it as a venerable product of sanctified attainment, showing the high-water mark of the Christian faith at the time of its preparation. I reverence it greatly for what it has accomplished, but it is only the product of fallible human intellect."

"Does the confession satisfy you in its statements about reprobation, election etc.?" "No, it does not. I have always thought that while the Sovereignty of God was sufficiently emphasized, human freedom was not so fully developed as it might have been."

"What do you think of the Confession in general terms?" "I think an additional short statement might be added to the Confession, which would be a modification of the doctrine."

"Does the Confession satisfy you in its statements about reprobation, election, etc.?" "Yes, and I think the proposal to revise the Confession is unwise, and that it is not at all justified by the higher standard, the Bible, which it teaches."
