thereof, but neither the Pactor at Fairford or the Land Dept. of the H. B. Co. had authorized the same and the description does not show it. I surmise that the Surveyors that laid out the settlement Lots made that out off in order to give settlement Lot 15 a frontage in the River.

All the old lines were found, but only one old post the S. E. Corner but the cuttings and blazes were quite distinct. I planted 4 Iron posts 3 with trenches and the 4th with a mound (the S.E. Corner). These posts were marked H. B. C. on the side facing the reserve.

I do not make the area the same as shown on the settlement plan or in the original description.
