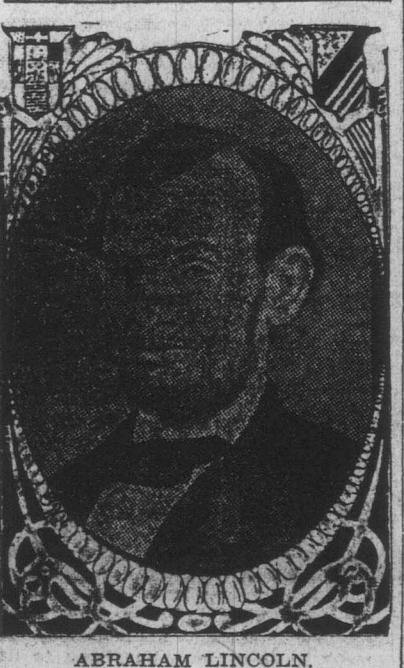


CENTENARY OF LINCOLN'S BIRTH

New York's Tribute. The federal, county and municipal departments, and many branches of business were closed to make the holiday climax to the Lincoln centenary week. With the principal demonstration of the day held in the auditorium the actor was Woodrow Wilson, president of Princeton University, and the invocation was delivered by Rev. Father Maurice J. Dorney, of Chicago.

OPTIMISM OVER PANAMA CANAL

WILL BE OPEN FOR TRAFFIC WITHIN 6 YEARS, SAYS TAFT

President-elect Is Well Satisfied With Results of His Trip.

New York, Feb. 12.—President-elect Taft landed yesterday from Panama, and was enthusiastically received by the whole city, whose guests he is to be until to-morrow.

Mr. Taft made a brief speech in which he heartily approved the present work of the canal across the Isthmus of Panama.

He reviewed a parade of citizens, miles in length, and last night attended one of the carnival season balls, that of the Elvies of Oberon. To-day Mr. Taft will address the negro Y. M. C. A., and will spend several hours in automobile. At night he will be the guest of honor at an elaborate banquet, at which nearly 500 prominent citizens will pay \$25 a plate to participate.

On Saturday morning the president-elect will go to Cincinnati, whence he will leave on Monday for Washington returning again to Cincinnati on Wednesday.

The first news of the constitutional obstacles against the appointment of Mr. Knevel to cabinet position was received by wireless on Wednesday. That Mr. Taft was somewhat disturbed over the situation was admitted, but early yesterday he received the news of the disposition of congress to amend the cabinet salary law, and he was inclined to take this as a happy solution of the difficulty.

The inability of the board of civil engineers to complete their report on the resolution regarding which their advice has been asked in connection with the Panama canal made the Washington visit by Mr. Taft necessary. The engineers will go at once to Washington to complete their work, and it may be stated that their report will be a complete approval of the present plans and methods on the isthmus. They will not only recommend the construction of the Gatun dam, but will give it as their judgment that the dam will be perfectly safe if built to a height of 115 instead of 135 feet, thus saving expense in construction.

In his speech on the steps of the city hall here yesterday, Mr. Taft made what he said was his summing up of his recent trip. "I am here on my return from a great construction work," he said, "and I am glad to say to you that work is going on as fast as you wish it to go on; that on the first of January, 1915, at latest, if not before, the canal will be opened for traffic, and when that time comes you will see floating on this river your marine commerce bound through these states to the west coast of North America, to the west coast of South America, to the Orient and to Australia. The board of engineers, who accompanied me have examined the whole work, and they say it is good, that it shall go on as it has gone on, that the organization on the isthmus, the American push and the good feeling there commends itself to them as men who understand great works of that class, and convinces them that the canal is now an immediate prospect."

SCOTT'S BURIAL PLACE. Ambrose Lepine Denies That He Will Dismantle Secret.

PITTSBURG GRAFT TRIALS NEXT TUESDAY

Hearing in Cases of Three Out of Nine Men Indicted.

Pittsburg, Pa., Feb. 12.—The cases against three of the nine men indicted recently in connection with the council graft scandal in this city will be called for trial next Tuesday. Wm. Ramsey, former president of the German National Bank; August Vilsack, former cashier of that institution, and J. F. Kline, a common councilman of this city, will be tried separately on charges of misdemeanor. In addition there are two separate cases against Ramsey and Vilsack for bribery, a joint indictment against Ramsey and Vilsack for misdemeanor, and a conspiracy charge against the three men in which all are jointly indicted, making nine cases in all to be called against them.

JINGOISTIC SPIRIT DYING IN CALIFORNIA

Legislators Inclined to Finally Dispose of Japanese Questions.

Sacramento, Calif., Feb. 12.—Moderation on the part of the legislature, and an evident disposition finally to dispose of all measures relating to Japanese and other aliens characterized yesterday's session of the legislature. Adopting a suggestion by Governor Gillett the assembly voted to appropriate \$15,000 to defray the expenses of a census which shall show the number of Japanese in California and the pursuits in which they are engaged. The statistics are to be used in consideration of future legislation, possibly involving a request by California for an Asiatic exclusion act.

W. R. TROTTER'S ATTACK ON SALVATION ARMY. London, Feb. 12.—At a meeting of the Edinburgh trades council yesterday, W. R. Trotter, Canadian labor representative in Great Britain, said the Salvation Army had issued a booklet entitled "The Surplus" which was so full of mis-statements in regard to Canada and emigration generally that the trades congress of Canada would shortly issue a reply. Mr. Trotter stated that the object of the book was to help emigrants so much as to acquire the government bonus upon agricultural laborers and commissions from steamship and railway fares.

ASIATIC CHOLERA. Another Serious Outbreak Is Reported From St. Petersburg.

St. Petersburg, Pa., Feb. 12.—There has been a serious outbreak of the Asiatic cholera among the staff of St. George hospital, an institution maintained by the Red Cross. Thirteen cases were recorded to-day and nine yesterday, and the total number of cases is thirty-eight.

CO-PARTNERY IN EMPIRE. Ottawa, Feb. 12.—Colonel Samuel Hughes has given effect to a resolution favoring a full partnership union of Great Britain, Ireland and the colonies, wherein each, retaining under its own control all matters specifically concerning it, all would unite on an equitable and independent footing in full partnership, the government dealing only with the intra-imperial, international, fiscal and imperial defence questions. The same resolution was twice proffered during the parliament and was provocative of much talk. It is Colonel Hughes' intention to press on the motion to a division.

C. P. RAILROAD MEN ARE DISSATISFIED

(Special to The Times.) Winnipeg, Man., Feb. 12.—The railroad brotherhoods at a conference here yesterday prepared a new and higher wage schedule to present to the management of the Canadian Pacific. There is great dissatisfaction over the matter of the runs, train men being kept too long away from their families at terminal points.

DEADLOOK AT SUBLIME PORTE

MINISTERS OF YOUNG TURK PARTY RESIGN

Serious Crisis in Struggle Between Rival Reform Parties.

Constantinople, Feb. 12.—The new government seems to be on the verge of a serious crisis, a result of the ministerial changes by which the two ministers of war and marine were replaced last Wednesday without the slightest reason volunteered. It is stated in semi-official circles that the changes were necessary to improve the efficiency of the respective departments.

ATTELL TO FIGHT DRISCOLL IN NEW YORK

Champion Featherweights Will at last Come Together—Nelson's Next Bout.

Darton, Ohio, Feb. 12.—Abe Attell's manager announced here last night that the California fighter had been matched to meet Jim Driscoll, the English champion, in New York on either the 18th or 19th of this month. The fight will be pulled off before the Fairmount Club if on the former date, and before the National if on the latter. Driscoll sails for England on the 20th instant.

TUNNEL WORKERS KILLED. Jersey City, N. J., Feb. 12.—Two men were killed, and one so badly injured that he may not recover, by an explosion in the McCadoo tunnel, along the Hudson river here to-day. The accident is supposed to have been the result of a premature blast.

REUNION OF CHRISTENDOM. Montreal, Que., Feb. 12.—At the first annual session of the synod of the diocese of Montreal, Bishop Parnell, in referring to the question of church union, said the Anglican church could never abandon her Catholic creeds and historic episcopate, but while taking this position, his lordship said: "We must nevertheless do everything in our power to further the reunion of Christendom, and I have no doubt that God in His own time will bring it about. In the meantime we must be true to our trust."

OUTCOME OF CASES' INQUIRY. Ottawa, Feb. 12.—It is understood that Messrs. Fraser and Spain, lighthouse commissioner and wreck commissioner respectively, are the two officials of the marine department who have stepped out as a result of the investigation by Judge Casels.

REDMOND'S TRIBUTE TO JOSEPH DEVLIN, M. P.

Ablest Man in Irish Party Since the Days of Parnell.

Belfast, Feb. 12.—Presiding last night at a banquet given in honor of Joseph Devlin, the Irish Nationalist member of parliament for Belfast, and in recognition of his services to the party during his recent visit to the United States, John Redmond paid a remarkable tribute to his colleague's genius for organization.

Since the days of Parnell, said Mr. Redmond, no man had entered the Irish party with such commanding political genius and ability as Joseph Devlin's. He was a tower of strength to the Irish party in parliament, and they turned to him also to keep the national movement in Ireland strong and powerful, and in the end united. The success of the American mission was largely due to him.

Irish M. P. Forcibly Ejected. Dublin, Feb. 12.—Lawrence Ginnell, member of parliament from the north division of Westmeath, was forcibly ejected from a meeting of the Irish party with such commanding political genius and ability as Joseph Devlin's.

Mr. Ginnell, speaking for the electric company, put the limit at which the city could undertake to develop power at 15 years anyway. One of the aldermen put it at 25 years. The money was needed in other channels. The Sook lake as a power proposition was admitted to be a poor one. There was no need to hide this fact because the electric company has gone fully into the whole question of power on the southern part of Vancouver Island. For years its engineers have been seeking the available sources of power, and the company has the fullest information on the subject. Sook lake was regarded by the company as not being within the realm of a commercial proposition. This many of the aldermen admitted. It was stated that even if 20,000,000 gallons of water were available at Sook lake it would not give anything like the power derived from 15,000,000 gallons at Goldstream, which is 670 feet about the sea. Sook lake is only about 450 feet above the sea level, and in order to get the necessary fall to generate power the water would have to be carried many miles. The initial cost of equipping, with so many other claims in the line of street improvements, was also put forward as a handicap for the city.

City as Competitor. On the part of the Electric Company the presence of a clause in the statutes giving the city the right to enter the field as a power and light vendor was attended with grave dangers, according to Mr. Goward. The city might realize that there was no danger from the city being able to enter the field for a long time, yet the investors in London did not realize this. They were faced with the right of the city to enter into competition and the result was the withholding of the necessary money for developing the power available.

The Electric Company asks no protection from any other company coming in and entering into competition. It asks for a clause similar to that in the Vancouver charter as pressed for last year when the city asked for power privileges before the legislature.

Ald. Henderson wanted some reductions in the powers of the Electric Company under its charter instancing the case of Vancouver where a considerable sum was derived for the use of the streets for electric railway purposes, but Mr. Goward said his company would not agree to open their charter to any amendments. The amendments must be through the Municipal Act.

At the meeting last night Manager Goward presented the company's side of the proposition as a basis for discussion. He referred to the fact that it was but renewing what was asked last year. In a letter which he read the undertaking of the company was set forth. The municipality was not to exercise its right to go into the power and light business outside of that required for municipal purposes without first offering to purchase the plant of the company. If an agreement as to the price offered by the city it should be left to arbitration. If the company did not reply to the offer of purchase then the city was to be given the right to go ahead with its proposition.

Company's Proposal. The undertaking in return for this on the part of the company was set forth as follows: "The company will develop, in any event within three years, to erect and maintain a power plant as near as possible to Victoria and tributary to the city, which shall have a capacity of not less than 10,000 horse power, such horse power to be used in extensions of the electric railway, lighting and power systems in and around Victoria, and a sum of at least \$200,000 to be spent during the next three years on such extensions."

(b) When the plant is in operation the company will agree that the rates for electric light and power in Victoria and surrounding districts shall be similar to those now charged in Vancouver and surrounding districts, the Vancouver rates at this time being the lowest of any city in Canada.

(c) Whether the power plant is in operation the company will supply the city at the city electric lighting station an amount of electricity to be used for street lighting purposes equal to the power consumed as generated by the city for one-half of the present cost of generation; all further requirements of the city in this respect to be supplied by the company at the same rate, i.e., one-half the cost of present generation.

(d) If the city acquires additional water supply and has a surplus water for power purposes to dispose of the company shall then purchase such surplus power from the city pipe lines under a suitable head at a rate to be agreed upon, provided that the company shall not be obliged to take less than 1,000 continuous horse power at one time.

Engineers Cover Field. Mr. Goward said his company realized that this was a serious proposition. It was for the city to decide. The finances of the city were wanted for a variety of things, and even if the power was obtained the city could not exercise it for about 15 years. The money being needed in other lines. The company's engineers had been in the field for eighteen months, and they knew there was no water supply for power purposes within a commercial distance of Victoria with the exception of Jordan river. Even if the city could get the money it was an impossibility for it to go into this power business. All that a clause giving the city the right to enter the power and light business could do would be to block the company which was now prepared to make large extensions in the city.

The case of Vancouver was alluded to by him. The city had asked the same powers as Victoria. When the company got the same safeguards as it now asked from Victoria it began a policy of extension in and around Vancouver and New Westminster, and made great reductions in the rates, in spite of the fact that wages were high on the Pacific Coast. Vancouver was getting cheaper electricity than any other place in Canada. The extension of the Sook lake power, a distance of 65 miles, was referred to by Mr. Goward. The company was expending \$10,000,000 on the mainland. This was of the greatest importance to Vancouver and New Westminster.

ELECTRIC COMPANY'S PROPOSALS

Expenditure of Two Millions Proposed Upon City's Agreeing to Purchase Undertaking Entering Into Competition.

The Electric Company before developing its river power proposition is seeking an agreement with the city similar to that asked last year. In brief the proposal is that the city go on with its application to get the right to deal in power and light, at the same time inserting provision by which the city, should it choose to exercise this power, shall first offer to buy out the company.

Provided this is agreed to and the provision made for it, the company will undertake to erect a power plant with a capacity of not less than 10,000 horse power, and will make extensions of the electric railway and light and power systems in and about the city, the sum of a quarter of a million at least being spent within three years. The rates for electric light and power, it is agreed, shall not be higher than in Vancouver at the present time, and for the city lighting the company will supply to the municipality at its power house all the power required at half the rate it costs the city to generate it now. The company further agrees to take any surplus water from the river for power purposes. The company's expenditure on the Jordan river plant is estimated at \$1,500,000. This is probably less than it will cost, and this will be expended in addition to what the city has expended in and about the city.
