

## EUROPEAN VETERANS' SPORTS SUCCESSFUL

A very large crowd enjoyed the ice sports on the Victoria rink last night held by the European War Veterans. The numerous events were handled quickly; each event was a real race; good time was made in the speed contests; the music was furnished by the 115th Battalion Band, recently returned from England, and all present appeared to have enjoyed themselves. The ice was in the very best condition for fast skating, and from the exhibition given by the speeders, it appears that St. John has not gone back for fast talent.

Fred Logan, the international champion, although considerably out of training, defeated Gordon Nuttall in a match 440 yards event, and made good time. Unfortunately Nuttall fell during the first lap of the race, and Logan had to finish alone.

Hilton Belyea, who holds the rink record of 2:52 1-5 attempted to break his record, and although he did not accomplish the feat he skated the mile in 2:54. He followed up by winning the mile open in 2:57. It shows that Belyea is still going fast.

H. Garnett was the star in the sprints, with M. Bell second, and in each of these events fast time was made.

The firemen, the street car men, policemen, letter carriers, and the ladies skated events, and all were interesting, but an exhibition showing how the wounded are gathered in on the field of battle was shown by two squads from the 165th Battalion, who were under the command of Sergeant Major Jack Redfern, R. M. C., and the exhibition was one of the best of the night. The supposed injured men were bandaged and carried to the starting point in perfect order. No. 2 squad won the event by the small margin of one second, and the gallant soldiers were loudly applauded. Col. McAvity examined the work and found that both squads were perfect.
