REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF CONSULTATION Re COLLEGE FEDERATION FUNDS.

Perceiving, as we do, the urgent necessity before us in relation to the Building and Endowment Funds of Victoria College, especially as the commencement of building operations must involve immediate and heavy expenses; therefore

Resolved,—(1) That as the Conference formerly expressed its willingness to accept \$35,000 as an equitable apportionment in prosecuting this great work, we do now reaffirm our previous decision, with the expectation that this amount, accepted by the Conference, will be proportioned to the Districts in time for the ensuing meetings.

(2) That the Chairmen of Districts be requested to bring the matter before the Financial District Meetings, with a view to a general canvass of our Conference, as far as possible, in the month of September.

(3) That we recommend the Secretary of Education to secure such help in canvassing and collecting, by means of a Conference agency, as may be found necessary.
