The Decisions of the Sub-Executive

DECEMBER 12, 1899.

It was decided to procure for Mr. Leckie and Miss Sproule \$15 or \$20 worth of French Gospels and Testaments, for use in the French lumber camps and settlements.

DECEMBER 21ST, 1899.

It was decided to ask Mrs. Mason, of Toronto, to fill the position of Superintendent of the Department of Hygiene and Heredity. Convention had left this appointment with Sub-Executive.

DECEMBER 21ST, 1899.

After taking two votes the following were elected representatives to the Dominion Alliance Council: Mrs. Thornley, Mrs. Goldie, Mrs. Urquhart, Mrs. Courtice. Names were sent to Mr. Spence.

DECEMBER 21ST, 1899.

A vote on the filling of the vacancy made in Sub-Executive ranks by the sudden death of our Treasurer, resulted in a decision to ask Mrs. Cavers to keep the books for the present. The feeling was that haste would be unwise.

FEBRUARY 20TH, 1900.

At Miss Sproule's request it was decided to authorize her to purchase 50 copies of Italian New Testaments, the price of which would be not more than six or eight cents each.

MARCH 10TH, 1900.

At the request of Mrs. Detlor, of North Bay, she was authorized to have the banner telescope case reduced to reasonable size.

MARCH 29TH, 1900.

It was discovered that the lady who had been asked to relieve Mrs. Waters, of Narcotics—Mrs. Courtice, of Toronto—could not act, so a Sub-Executive vote was taken which resulted in author-
