have just appeared here. Without exception, the Commissioners admit the necessity of giving to consumers some voice in the control of industrial policy, and their reports, though differing in methods proposed, all contain practical suggestions to give effect to this main purpose. Unless a plan of co-operation which will include the Community tan be worked out, I see no alternative but complete nationalization of industry. The obvious limitations of the latter make me hope that the former may yet be satisfactorily achieved.
