Ottawa, March 31, 1908.

Reverend Sir :-

With reference to your application for a grant of land for the school at Lac la Plonge, I beg to say that the land in question has not been surveyed and cannot, therefore, be homesteaded or sold. There is no objection, however, to your having the land taken and improved, and when the survey is made your claim in respect thereto will be liberally dealt with.

As regards your application to acquire power to be utilized in connection with an electric light plant which you desire to have installed, I have to say that every applicant for power privileges is required to file with the Minister of the Interior a statement in duplicate setting forth :-

- (a) His name, residence, and occupation.
- (b) The nature and location of the business, plant or manufactory in connection with which it is proposed to utilize the water power privileges.
