County Clerk of Middlesex was informed that a Plan shewing the site of the proposed bridge and the Right of Way waquined through the Indian Reserve, was required, and that on receipt of the said Plan, the Indians would be asked to surrender the land comprising the Right of Way. An Order in Council will then be applied for, which, if granted will provide for the aceptance of the Surrender, and will also suthorize the payment of the \$1000.00 shove mentioned.

I may say that this action was approved by the Deputy Minister, and no difficulty is apprehended in carrying it out.
