
Ottawa, 15th March, 1911.

Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 15th instant in respect to the case of Jessie Neveau, who has been ill at the General Hospital at Sault Ste. Marie for sometime, but who it is desired to have sent to the Toronto Free Hospital, and also in respect to the case of Annie Keyhekobinuse who is in the latter institution and who is pronounced cured; and in reply I have to inform you that you can make arrangements without delay to have the first mentioned girl sent under the care of a reliable person from Sault Ste. Marie, to Toronto and placed in the Toronto Free Hospital. This person can also bring Annie Keyhekobinuse back to her home. You should instruct the parents of Annie to give her such care as they possibly can in order that her health, which has been restored, may not be again impaired.

Accounts for the expenses incurred should be submitted to the Department for settlement. Economy should, of course, be observed.
