I am in receipt of your letter of the 30th ultime, in which you made application for the interest share of Ohme. Buff as a member of the Moravian Band of the Themas. for the half year ended 30th November, 1911; and in reply I enclose herewith cheque No. 1158 in his favour for \$5.00 being amount due.

With reference to the application of these. Buff to have the \$60.00 loan, to which he is entitled as a number of the Moravian Band of the Thames, paid to his brother, Alex. Buff. I beg to say that this request cannot be complied with while that a resident of the United States. The \$60.00 loan is an advance on interest money for ten years, and if these. Buff continues to reside in the United States for five years continuously (without the consent of the Superintendent general or his Agent) he will cease under the provisions of the Indian Act, to be a member of the band, and therefore will not be entitled to this money. If he resides upon the Reserve, the money can be advanced to him or to his brother, if he so desires. If these, Buff remains in the United States continuously for the period above stated, his name will be struck off the per-list.
