Sir,

Referring to the portion of your letter of the 30th ultimo, dealing with the question of disposition by Indians to White people, of the most productive parts of their hunting lands, I beg to point out that the Indians have no authority, under the Indian Act, to dispose of their hunting lands, and you should take whatever action may be necessary to put a stop to this improper leasing of land.

If the Indians desire to have any portion of their lands leased, application should be made through the local Indian Agent, to the Department for the requisite permission.
