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The charge sheet is signed by the President, marked "g" and annexed to the proceedings.

The accused is arraigned upon each charge in the above mentioned charge sheet.

Question to the accused.

Q-3 Are you guilty or not guilty of the first charge against you which you have heard read?
A-3 Guilty.

Q-4 Are you guilty or not guilty of the second charge against you which you have heard read?
A-4 Guilty.

The accused having pleaded guilty to both charges, the provisions of Rule of Procedure 33 (B) are here complied with.

The Court is closed for the consideration of the finding.

The Court having been re-opened the accused is again brought before it.

The accused, D-3943 Trooper John Mathew Caman, 17th D.Y.R.C.H., (7 Rec'ee Regt), is found guilty of both charges.

The summary of evidence is read, marked "h", signed by the President, and attached to the Proceedings.

PROCEEDINGS ON CONVICTION BEFORE SENTENCE.

CAPTAIN T.A. O'HARA, 17th D.Y.R.C.H. (7 Rec'ee Regt) is duly sworn.
Question by the President.

Q-5 Have you any evidence to produce as to the character and particulars of service of the accused?
A-5 Yes, sir, I have certified copy of M.P.M.C. and A.F.B. 398, Statement of Character and Particulars of Service of the accused.

The above statement is read, marked "i", signed by the President, and annexed to the Proceedings.

Q-6 Is the accused the person named in the statement which you have heard read?
A-6 He is.

Q-7 Have you compared the contents of the above statement with the regimental books?
A-7 I have, sir.

Q-8 Are they true extracts from the regimental books, and is the statement of entries in the conduct sheets a fair and true summary of those entries?
A-8 They are, sir.

Q-9 Have you any other evidence?
A-9 No, I have not.

The Defending Officer declines to cross-examine the witness.
Question to the accused.

Q-10 Do you wish to address the Court.

A-10 THE DEFENDING OFFICER ADDRESSES THE COURT IN MITIGATION OF PUNISHMENT:
