ell right.

MR. BLLES: I think you hed better.

THE CHAIRMAN: And you are using water from the Similkameen? MR.BALLS: Yes.

MR. ALEXANDER: They take it out here from the power company.
MR. BALLS: Yes.

MR. AMEXAMORY: Then you have an agreement with the company?
MR. BALLS: Do you know of any existing agreement?

MR. BALL: Not a thing, no.

MR.ALEXANDER: We would need that in order to give you a record which would authorize you to take the water from their works. You probably got the right in return for giving them the right-of-way for the flume.

MR.BALLS: There probably will be some agreement in regard to the right-of-way over the Reserve, an agreement with the Dominion Government.

MR.FLLIS: I don't know. Is it a matter of importance to file those agreements with your Department? Is that the practice ?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, so we can note in the licence, there was an agraement by which they could carry their water through the water power company's works.

MR.BALL: We have severel agreements with the mining companies.

MR. RLLIS: Check them all up and let the Board know.

MR.BALLS: Upper Similkameen Rumber 5, Wolf Greek. We have
a Provincial record dated January 50th, 1897, for 100
inches of mter from Wolf Greek. This was surveyed
by Provincial Water Rights Branch some years ago.

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
