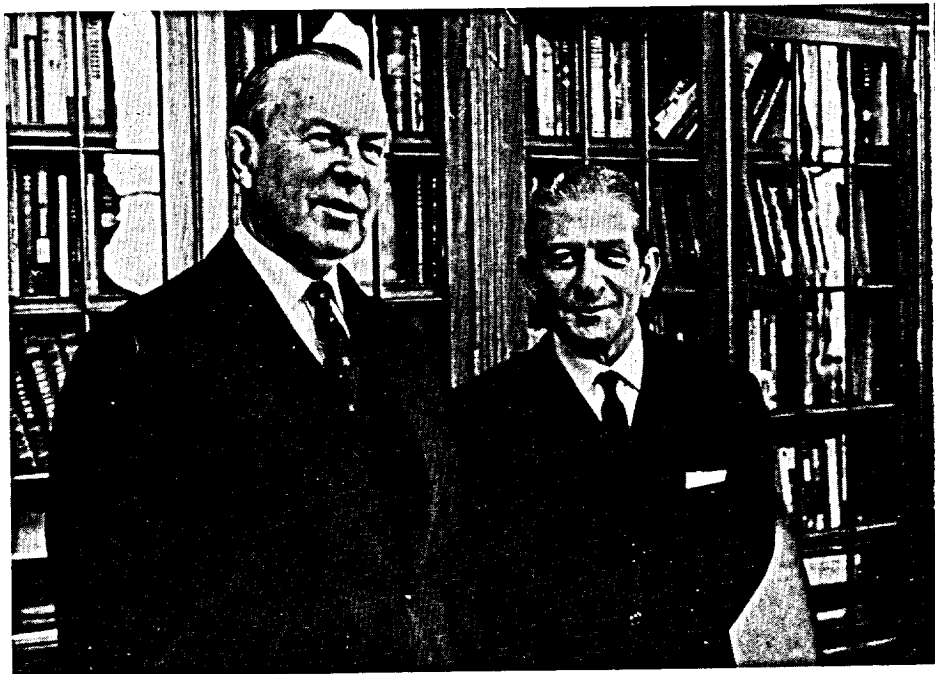


in the air-lift of oil products to Zambia from January to April 1966, necessitated by the oil embargo against Rhodesia. Through its External Aid Programme, Canada is providing Zambia with a number of Canadian teachers, some 15 to 20 petrol-storage tanks and a number of air-traffic specialists, who are helping to operate Lusaka's recently completed international airport.

Prime Minister of Malta

At the invitation of the Canadian Government, the Prime Minister of Malta, Dr. Giorgio Borg Olivier, recently paid his first visit to Ottawa, from November 21 to 23. In a ceremonial welcome, Dr. Borg Olivier was greeted by the Prime Minister on his arrival at Uplands Airport. The Maltese Prime Minister was then taken to Government House, where His Excellency the Governor General had invited him to stay.

Accompanied by Mr. F. E. Amato-Gauci, Maltese Secretary for Commonwealth and Foreign Affairs, Dr. Borg Olivier began his official discussions with Canadian Ministers and officials on November 22. International and Commonwealth topics were in the forefront of his talks with the Canadian Prime Minister. Subsequent separate meetings with the Ministers of Finance and Manpower and Immigration and the Acting Minister of Trade and Commerce, as well as with
