the members of His body to the same place of honor glory. Such is our rank now, and there we shall b person, when His work is completed.

And finally, the church is "the fullness, (or complete the 'pleroma') of Him that filleth all in all." A twithout a body is no more complete than a body with a head. And so there is no complete Christ without Church. It is written of Him, "As the body is one hath many members... so also is Christ." (1 Cor. 12: The Christ then that was raised by the power of God His own right hand, is the glorified Jesus, together wall the saints who form the completness of His body.

Such was the power of God to us-ward, which apostle earnestly desires that the saints may know, s for which he prays that the eyes of their heart may enlightened, that they may realize it in all its fulne May that prayer be answered in each of us.
