House Arrangements

S it is important that the social and domestic side of a girl's life at School shall be, as far as possible, lived apart from the environment of the Class-room, those portions of the building which are designed for Residential use are distinct and separate from the School sections. For convenience, however, covered communication is provided between these two main parts of the Building. There are at present two Houses, and additional Houses are contemplated for a later date. Each House is in charge of a House Mistress, who is responsible to the Principal for the order and comfort of the girls, and each House has its separate Sitting room where the girls spend their free time.
