RAY AND SHEEP

Prices for the highest grades of hay have dropped slightly from those given last week. The market, however, is extremely active, and there is a good market for all hay available due to the scarcity in the United States.

HIDES

Latest quotations for city hides are: No. 1 inspected steers and cows, 12 1/2 to 20; No. 2, 11 1/2 to 19; city calf skins, 15 to 20.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

The quality of the fruit season offered on the local market has greatly improved. Fine samples and liberal receipts of peaches and apples are being received.

HONEY

Wholesalers are selling buckwheat at 65 to 7 to lb. in tins, and 6 1/4 in bibbs, while strained clover is selling at 50 lb. in 60-lb. tins, 5 to 10 lb. tin.

EGGS AND POULTRY

Egg quotations are unchanged. Receipts show a tendency to drop off and the quality is improving slightly. Prices for new laid eggs in wholesale lots are quoted at 22 to 25, and fresh gathered 18 to 19.

DAIRY PRODUCE

The market for dairy produce is extremely active. Demand for cream is high. The Old Country, from the Canadian West, and the higher prices now ruling in the United States command a premium for all offerings.

LIVE STOCK

Live stock prices are better all along the line. Prices started to go up on the first market of last week.

The first increase, week ago today, averaged 10c to 15c on choice stock. At Monday's prices, live stock was active in great demand. The week ended with a 25c advance on the Thursday market.

The trade in feeders and stockers has been slow. The short hay crop in sections of the province, together with the short pasture, has kept farmers cautious about buying.

Lambs are on the up grade, ewes being quoted at \$3 to \$4.25; lambs, 87 to \$1.50; and bucks at \$5.50 to \$7.

Hog prices in Canada seem to run from one extreme to the other, and it is questionable whether the present prices for a year have run up and down as much as Buffalo prices, a difference of 50c to 1.00 being maintained.

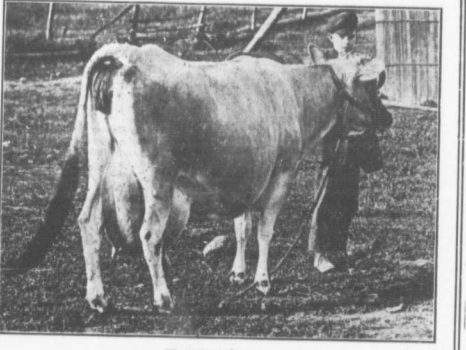
