

CHILDBEN'S FEET. Life-long discomfort and sudden death often come to children through the inattention or carelessness of tha mothers or nurses. A child should never be allowed to go to sleep with cold feet. The thing to be last attended to is to see that the

feet are dry and warm, Neglect of this has often resulted in dangerous attacks of croup, diphtheria, or fatal sore throat. Always, on coming home from school, on entering the house from a visit, or errand, in rainy, muddy, or damp weather, the child should remove his shoes, and the mother should ascertain whether the stockings are in the least damp. If they are, they should be taken off, the feet held before the fire, or rubbed with the hands till perfectly dry, and another pair of stockings and another pair of shoes put on. The reserve shoes and stockings should be kept ready for use on a minute's notice.
