

Then, the Question, so amended, being put :—It was resolved in the Affirmative.

On motion of Mr. *Taschereau*, seconded by Mr. *Robitaille*, the said Bill was, with the leave of the House, withdrawn.

A Bill to amend chapter fifteen of the Consolidated Statutes for *Lower Canada*, respecting Public Education, was, according to order, read the third time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Solicitor General *Langevin*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Solicitor General *Cockburn*, the Bill was amended by adding the following Proviso at the end thereof, "Provided always, that nothing in this Act shall have the effect of authorizing possession to be taken of any property held by a *fabrique*, church, body, corporation or association for religious or scholastic purposes."

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill to amend the practice of the Court of Chancery for *Upper Canada*, being read;

Ordered, That the said Order be discharged.

Ordered, That the Bill be withdrawn.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill to amend 29th *Victoria*, chapter 39, intituled, "An Act to impose a tax on Dogs, and to provide for the better protection of Sheep in *Upper Canada*," being read;

The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and referred to the Select Committee, to which was referred the Bill to amend and consolidate the several Acts respecting the Assessment of Property in *Upper Canada*.
