## JOURNAL OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

Ordered, On Motion, that the Clerk do notify the Chaplain to attend the House each morning as usual.

Ordered, on Motion of Mr. Solicitor General, That the ftanding Rules and Regulations be read and continued in force (the 9th and 15th Rules being excepted) likewife that the Clerk collect from the feveral Journals all fuch Rules and Regulations as heretofore were made permanent, and fubmit them to the Houfe for their Infpection.

Ordered, on Motion of Mr. Solicitor General, feconded by Angus M<sup>c</sup>Aulay, Esq. that the Houfe do at its fitting tomorrow, refolve itfelf into a Committee to consider of a Bill lately paffed by the Legislature of this Ifland, entitled "An Act to "confirm the Titles and quiet the possefsions and Locations in this Colony of the "American Loyal Emigrants and disbanded troops," and which Bill has not receiv-"ed, his Majefty's Royal Allowance, and that the Clerk do then lay before the Houfe, fuch paper as he may have in his possefsion, relative to the faid Bill.

Adjourned till 10 o'clock to-morrow morning.

TUESDAY, 11th AUGUST, 1812.

THE House met pursuant to adjournment. The Chaplain attended agreable to orders and faid Prayers.

The order of the day being read, on motion the house refolved itself into a committee of the whole house to take into confideration a Bill, entitled an Act to confirm the Titles and quiet the possession and Locations, in this Colony, of the American Loyal Emigrants (Mr. Solicitor General in the Chair) and after some time spent therein, the Speaker refumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported, "That the Committee deem it expedient that Witnesses should be examined, and other proofs produced before the House to substantiate the charges brought forward by the Loyalist, that an early day should be appointed for such examination; Ordered that the Report of the Committee be agreed to.

Moved by the Solicitor General, and seconded by Mr. Hyde, that this Houfe do, at its fitting on Saturday next, enter into an examination of Witnefses and other proofs, to substantiate the charges brought forward by the Loyalsts, with liberty for any of the Members to apply in the mean time for the Speaker's. Summons, desiring the attendance of witnefses, which motion was carried nem. con.

Ordered, On motion of Dr, M'Aulay, seconded by Mr. Nelfon, that a committee be appointed to examine and report upon the Expiring Laws; and that Dr. M'Aulay, Mr. Solicitor General, and Mr. Worrell, do compose the faid Committee,

On Motion of Mr. Solicitor General, feconded by Dr. M'Aulay, that a Committee be appointed to correspond with the Colony Agent; and that His Majefty's Council be requested to name a Committee to act conjunctly with them, and the house divided and there appeared
