The sheriff will enter the cells of the condemned accompanied by members of the press at 7:30 and will read the death warrants to them.

New York, Dec. 19.—A copy of the statement made before the Court of Third Instance in Guatemala by W. G. Hunter, jun., son of the United States minister to Guatemala, regarding the shooting of William A. Fitzgerald, has been received here.

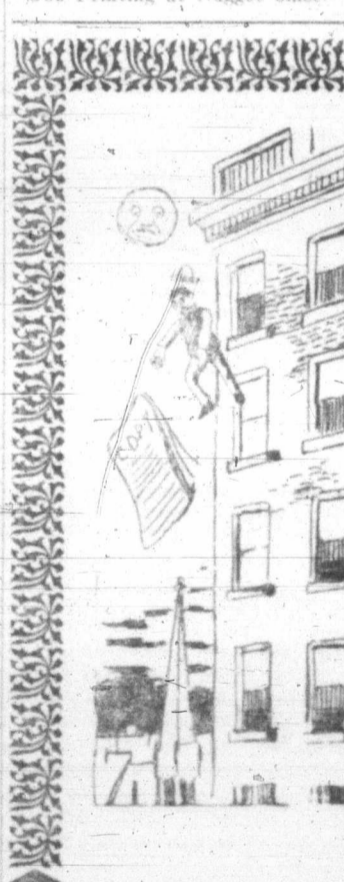
Next week Mr. Bertrand will make an inspection of the whole of the new government road from here to Whitehorse, and may suggest some improvements or repairs upon it.
