LONDON, April 19—"We improved our position slightly south of Monchy-La-Pex," says the official report from British Headquarters in France tonight. "Today we further progressed east of Fampoux and in the enemy's trenches south of Loos, where we again captured prisoners.

"South of Lens an enemy bombing attack upon one of our advanced positions was successfully beaten off.
"The total number of guns captured to date is two hundred and twenty-eight."
