"The society woman and the working woman both live a strenuous life of constant exhaustion. The gay life of pleasure of the one woman and the drudgery of the other are continuously decreasing their nervous strength and energy, and when brain-fagged and physically exhausted they marry they become the mothers of physical starvelings, who develop into men and women unfit for the burdens of life. they become the mothers of physical starvelings, who develop into men and women unfit for the burdens of life, who, in their turn, live in the manner of their parents, weaker and even less able to stand the nervous tension of work and dissipation. These people are often predisposed to insanity and nervous diseases, while often the result is degeneration and imbecility. "When men make it possible for women to return to their proper place of home and motherhood, and they can cease their pitful struggle for existence, leaving the obtaining of a livelihood to the men of the family—then the conditions that produce in-

livelihood to the men of the family— then the conditions that produce in-sanity will diminish.

"Among the foreign laborers, bad whiskey and beer cause more in-sanity than does anything elso. The reason is that the drink is 'doctored' with cocolus indicus or 'fish berry,' that is used by the Chinese in catch-ing fish.

"In other words, drugs and whiskey combined are a good combination upon which to build a lunatic."

NEW STORIES OF THE IRON DUKE

A recent volume of personal reminiscences of the Duke of Wellington written by the Earl of Ellesmere and edited by his daughter Alice, Countess of Stafford, gives some new and entertaining tales of the Iron Duke. We are told here that the Duke considered Hannibal far and away the greatest soldier on record. Of his own antagonists he spoke of Massena as the most dangerous. Soult he thought the best strategist, but "very defective and irresolute in actual collision." It is a curious fact that the Duke never,—except once by accident—read anything bearing on his own military career. "He said," writes Lord Ellesmere, "that they would merely tempt and provoke him to comments which he could not make without offence to living men. Before I knew this I once asked him for his opinion on a passage in Napier, with whose work I took it for granted he was familiar He positively refused to read even an extract." That the Duke kept himself, as well as his troops, under Spartan discipline, there can be no doubt. For three years in India he lived on little but rice; and his worst outbreak was when, on arriving at Dover in 1814, after six years' absence abroad, the first order he gave at the Ship Inn was for "an unlimited supply oof buttered toast."
