# Sweep In The State of Maine

Portland, Maine, Sept. 14—Maine gave an overwhelming plurality to the Republican ticket in the state election yesterday, with a total vote larger by 55,000 than the highest

ever previously in the state.

Fraderick Parkhurst, of Bangor,
was elected governor by a majority
of 65,000 over his Democratic opposent. Bertrand G. Mclutyre, of Norway. The plurality was 17,000 more
than the largest obtained by any other gubernatorial candidate. In the
history of the state.

Four Republican congressmen
were elected by larger pluralities.

Every member of the State Senste will be a Republican while of a membership of 151 in the State House of Representatives, the Democrate succeeded in electing only 15. In the last legislature there were 2 Democratic senators and 41 Democratic representatives. presentatives. Roy L. Hardwel, of Augusta, Republican, was easily, re-elected state auditor. All the new county sheriffs are Republicans. The vote of the state for governor, returns from forty small towns and plantations in remote disricts miss ing, was:

Parkhurst, Republican, 133,817. McInyre, Democratic, 62,249.

The increase in the total yote was very lawgely accounted for by the presence of women at the polls for presence of women at the polls for the first time. All over the state wo-men showed themselves eager to grasp the opportunity of exercising their franchise, and they were un-daunted by a heavy downpour of rain in the afternoon. The result showed that most of them voted the Republi-can ticket.

As the returns came in showing from the first evidences of a tremendous Republican sweep, Democratic state leaders were allent as to the possible significance of the vote with relations to the presidential election in November. Coll Parkhurst, after heing assured of his election, gave the viewpoint of the Republicans in a statement in which he reprinted the viewpoint of the Republicans in a statement in which he pointed out that the campaign had been "vigorously contested by the Democrats on national issues," and said that the outcome gave "most conclusive evidence that the voters of Maine resent the autocratic and un-American ad-ministration that the Democrats have given us." He declared that it was qually an endorsement of Harding and Coolidge."

Italiters of merely state importance were hardly touched upon in the quantalsn. The leading speakers were men of national prominence, both parties striving to effect a good showing in "the barometer state," the only state in the Union to hold its state election in advance of the voting for president.

The only woman who was a candidate for public office at the election was defeated. Mrs. Margaret Dyre, of Bar Harbor, who was the Democratic candidate for registrar of probate in Hancock county. She received only a small yets.
