London, Jan. 28 .- The British navy may soon b egiven a new and "unsurpassed" weapon in a large caliber shell which will pierce the heaviest armor without shattering, said Sin Robert Hadfield, chairman and managing director of Hadfield's, Limited, steel manufacturers, recently. He indicated that possession of such a shell durin gthe great war would have been of inestimable value to the British
