WANTS TO TALK TO MARS.

Camille Flammarion, Thinks That it

May be Accomplished Some Day.

Paris, May 25.—M. Camille Flam-

marion, the astronomer, in an inter-

view regarding the plan of Professor

Pickering, of Harvard, to signal to

Mars, said that it was quite within

the bounds of possibility that in some

future era the earth might succeed in

establishing communication.

"Every condition," he said, "points

to the probability of Mars being in-

habited, but the epoch in which the

inhabitants of Mars might be able

successfully to communicate with the

earth has not yet come for us, though

it has perhaps long ago gone for the

Martians.

"All our studies agree in represent-

ing Mars as much older than the

earth. Whatever the form of Martian

humanity, those brothers of ours in

the heavens are probably infinitely

superior intellectually to us, who have

not yet learned to conduct our own

affairs and who spend three-quarters

of our total resources in maintaining

armed men.

"If the Martians ever had any idea

of communicating with the earth it

was probably many millions of years

ago in the remotest and barest period

of the earth's existence. Never hav-

ing found any reply the Martians

probably concluded either that the

earth was uninhabited or that its peo-

ple were engaged in a much grosser

occupation than the study of the

universe."
