City Council Will Discuss Building of Workingmen's Homes

On Monday night next a special session of the City Council will be held for the purpose of discussing the erection of workingmen's homes. As outlined by Mayor Gosling at the regular weekly meeting of the Board last night, a building site of 138 feet frontage and rearage of from 32 to 60 feet has been offered at a reasonable figure, providing space for several dwellings in the eastern section of the city, a few minutes walk from the street car line and where there is a scarcity of houses. If the site and plans are approved of, the Mayor intends to build seven dwellings and, if the expenditure prove justified, operations will be continued more extensively. Already the Mayor has the assurance that there is no cause for worry over the financial aspect of the project.
