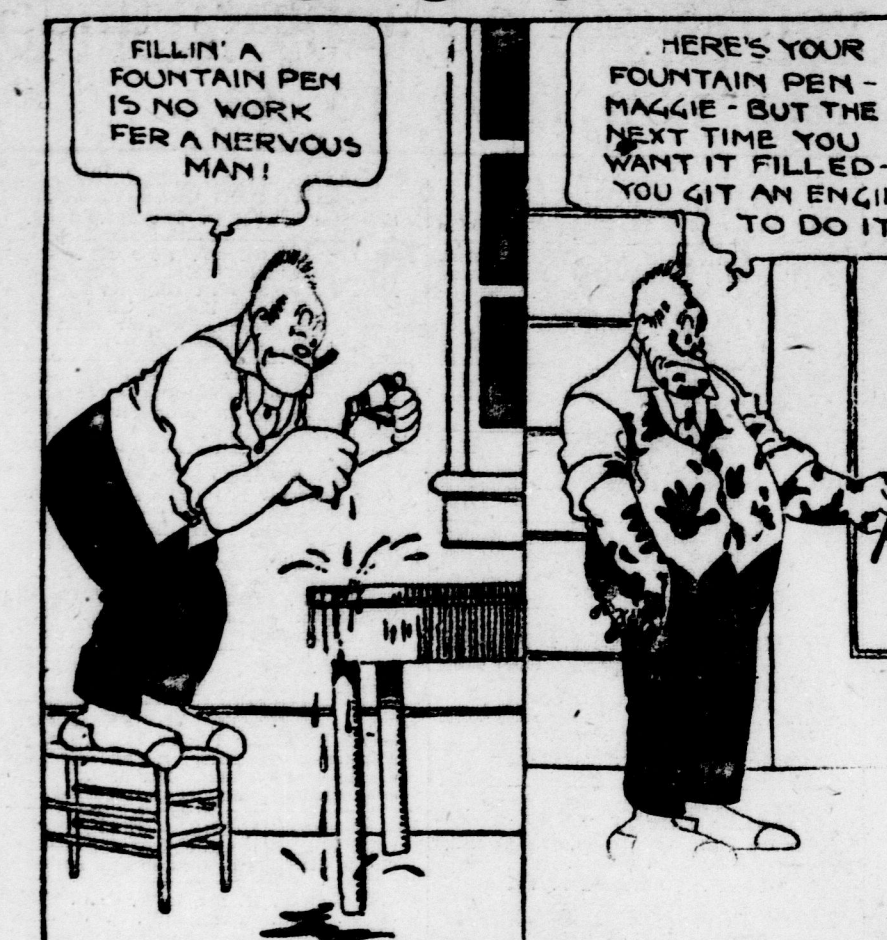

**SAYS JULY WILL SEE END OF WAR**

Financial Writer Thinks Expenses Will Exhaust Some Belligerents.

[Canadian Press.] LONDON, March 17.—3:10 a.m.—Edgar Crammond, a prominent financial writer, read a paper before the Royal Statistical Society yesterday, dealing with the cost of the war. In his opinion the war must end in July, through the exhaustion of some of the belligerents.

Mr. Crammond estimates the total cost of the war to the end of July as \$18,500,000,000, and the total economic loss, through damage to property and other indirect losses, at \$45,700,000,000. He estimates that Great Britain alone will spend up to the end of July \$708,000,000.

**BULGARIA PREVENTED GREECE FROM HELPING**

LONDON, March 17.—12:14 a.m.—A Reuters dispatch from Rome, given an interview with the correspondent of the Corriere della Sera has had with Eleutherios Venizelos, the former premier of Greece, in which Mr. Venizelos is quoted as saying that twice since the outbreak of the war the Allies have asked Greece to send men to help Serbia, but the attitude of Bulgaria prevented Greece from doing so.

**PROMISES BY LATEST MEXICAN PRESIDENT**

Garza to Assure Public Safety—No Disorder in the Capital.

[Canadian Press.] Mexico City, March 17.—A long statement in which he pledges himself to take every possible precaution to assure the safety of the public in Mexico City, was issued last night by Provisional President Roque Gonzalez Garza. He announced that martial law would be declared today.

Washington, March 17.—Official dispatches reaching the state department today told of the return to Mexico City of Roque Gonzalez Garza, elected provisional President by a convention of generals January 27.

**STARS AND STRIPES USED BY CORSIKAN**

MONTREAL, March 16.—The stars and stripes were hoisted from the mast of the liner Corsican while she was steaming down the Mersey on her way from Liverpool to Halifax on her last voyage, because two German submarines were waiting in the waters hard by, according to one of the passengers on the Corsican, Mr. David McKay, of the C. P. R. freight department, Winnipeg, who arrived in Montreal last night from Halifax.

**GERMAN LINER ESCAPES**

Interned Boat Gets Away From the Canary Islands.

LONDON, March 16.—2:38 a.m.—A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Las Palmas, Canary Islands, dated Monday, says: "The interned German liner Macedonia disappeared from this port during the night. The Macedonia was towed here by a Spanish cruiser last November from Palma, and was moored in the inner harbor, where the authorities removed parts of her machinery."

**BERLIN CALM OVER DRESDEN DESTRUCTION**

[Canadian Press.] Berlin, March 17.—The destruction of the cruiser Dresden at Juan Fernandez Island came as no surprise to the German nation. Newspapers generally express wonder that she should so long have evaded hostile warships. They praise the successful raids of the cruiser on commerce, and the hero is the captain.

**VERVILLE SHOWS RESULT**

Canada's War Expenses Are Paid With Borrowed Money.

[Special to The Advertiser.] OTTAWA, March 17.—The budget debate closed at 11 o'clock this morning. The Government had its majority, and after defeating the Laurier amendment carried the resolution to put on customs stamp and business taxes.

**Prices Go Up**

"Prices go up but there is no announcement of wages going up," commented Mr. Verville, who was in the House today. He said that the tariff would be a boon to the manufacturer, but a curse to the consumer. The labor man urged that if more taxes had to be levied it should take the form of a direct tax levied on the consumer.

**NOT A WAR BUDGET**

The House today passed the budget which was introduced by Mr. E. M. MacDonald, Liberal, who followed, and denounced those who held that in a free country the tariff proposal could not be discussed by the Opposition without the "disloyal" being raised. This was not a war budget, War operations were provided for by loans from England.

**TAY PAY SETTLES STRIKE WITH A BEER FUND**

NEW YORK, March 16.—T. P. O'Connor, the National leader, settled the strike of coal passers on the Liverpool docks, which tied up the transatlantic liners for more than a week—settled it in 24 hours by agreeing to have the strikers each advance a shilling a day for beer, according to the terms of the settlement. **SALVATION ARMY CAPT. IS MOVED TO DRESDEN**

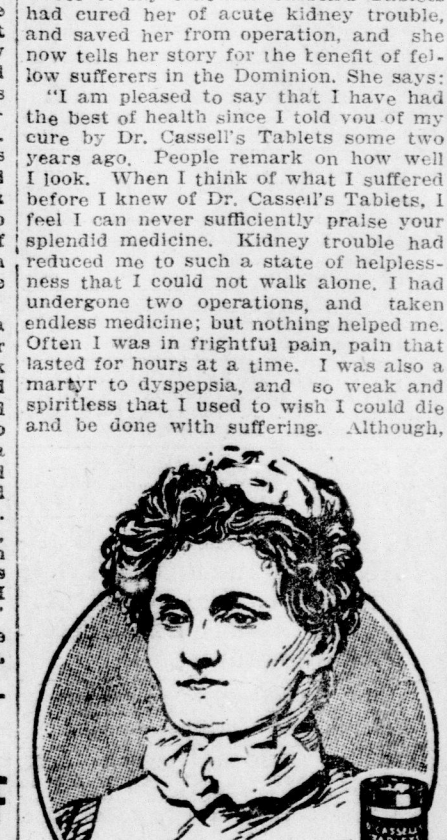
