SAYS CHURCHILL TRIED TO INCITE

Lenine Blames Clemenceau's **Agents For Promoting** Trouble.

HOLDS OLIVE BRANCH

Soviet Recognizes Polish Independence-Wants Peaceful Settlement.

LONDON, Jan. 29 .- A wireless dispatch received from Moscow says that a declaration signed by Premier Lenin, Foreign Minister Tchitcherin and Minister of War Trotzky addressed to the Polish Government on behalf of the council of the peoples' commissaries, invited a friendly settlement of all disputes and manufacture and countries and putes and questions outstanding be-tween Poland and Soviet Russia.

Accuses Agents.
At the beginning, the declaration says that it is incumbent on the Polish Government to decide whether or not to make war on Russia. It proceeds to accuse the agents of Winston Spencer Churchill, the British war minister, and M. Clemenceau, the former French premier, of endeavoring to incite Poland to a "senseless, commercial war against Soviet Russia."

Recognize Independence.

The. declaration, asserts, that the Soviet Government from the first, recognized.

Soviet Government from the first, recognized the independence and sovereignty of the Polish republic, and that this will be confirmed at the February meeting of the supreme executive committee of the Soviet. Further, it declares there is no territorial, economic or other question which cannot be solved peacefully by negotiation, concessions and mutual agreements, such on the care of the dully by negotiation, concessions and mutual agreements, such as are now being arranged with Esthonia.
