BANK ROBBERS HOLD UP BANK

Quebec Branch Entred And Robbed of \$2,500.

MEN GOT AWAY.

ST. ALME, Que. Oct. 21—Another bank burglary was pulling off in this province early this morning when a gang of armed bandits blew up the safe in the Banque Nationale branch here and carried off \$2,500, getting away with the loot.

The robbery was marked by the same cool audacity which characterized the five or six bank robberies which this same gang has pulled off at various rural centres the past few months. They had apparently laid all day in ambush near the village, and shortly after midnight invaded the sleeping village.

A big Danish hound kept as a watch dog by Manager Cadoret of the bank, was drugged and the burglars, entering the bank through a window.

Three attended to the safe while two watched the side of the building and another was posted at the entrance.

The first intimation of their work was when their first charge of nitroglycerine awakened Mr. Grant, who roused over the bank with his family. He seized his revolver, ran down and opened fire on the men, whom he discovered preparing the second charge in the safe door. They at once returned the fire and Mr. Cadoret, outnumbered, retired, several bullets striking the doorway on either side of him.

The first intimation of their work was when their first charge of nitroglycerine awakened Mr. Grant, who roused over the bank with his family. He seized his revolver, ran down and opened fire on the men, whom he discovered preparing the second charge in the safe door. HYDRANT TEST MADE MONDAY.

Firemen Used Hydrants In Different Levels of The Town.

GREAT IMPROVEMENT.

A fire alarm was given by the steam whistles at the power house yesterday morning to call out the firemen to make a test of the water pressure at the hydrants available for fire purposes. The result of the test was eminently satisfactory. From the hydrant at the Catholic church, one of the highest points in the town, a powerful volume of water was thrown over the building with considerable force, while from the hydrant at the west end of Gerard street, another of the highest, not indeed the very highest point in the town, an equally powerful stream was easily obtained to completely cover the neighboring buildings. While these streams were being thrown up, hose taps in the vicinity were opened and the water in all cases maintained a good strong pressure and hardly seemed to be effected at all by the pressure which the water naturally be withdrawn by the hydrants being open at the same time.

Our town has now one of the best water systems in the Maritime provinces and our mayor and councilors as well as our citizens generally are to be congratulated on the results obtained by the installation of the sixteen inch water main, which accounts entirely for our increased water pressure. It may be here stated that the entire cost of the installation of this main was less than one-half of \$45,000.00, the amount which the Tribune stated it cost.

Theorists may still continue to theorize, but seeing it believing, and facts are very stubborn things. One fact is that we have now a very much greater pressure in our water system in all parts of the town since the high water main has been connected with the 10 inch pipe, at the west end of the town. In the locations in the town there is now an abundance of water with excellent pressure in the highest flats at all times of the day, besides ample pressure for fire protection from the hydrant on their premises, where very little water and scarcely any cost previously existed notwithstanding the fact that the water has even yet to pass through a 4 inch pipe from Prince William street through the whole length of McGillivray Ave. and Chapel St. When the new main will be completed and extended as it is proposed, along the northern portion of the town, to Prince William street, the water pressure in the town will be maintained throughout the whole town.

SAMSON TRIAL NEARING THE END

Many Witnesses Examined and Evidence Seems to Point to Accident.

DOCTORS ARE HEARD.

PERCE Oct. 21—The Crown began yesterday to examine its witnesses in the first evidence heard was that of Dr. Jos. Arthur Pigeon, surgeon of Perce, coroner for the district of Gaspe. On the 11th of March last he was called to Grand River by a telegram from Dr. Samson, who is now the prisoner at the bar. On that day he held an inquest at the prisoner's house on the body of Colonne Lafontaine, wife of Dr. Samson. Before the inquest, the prisoner handed him a bottle labelled "Tincture of Colombs". SANDY MONACELLI GETS LIFE SENTENCE

Found Guilty of Manslaughter and Was Immediately Sentenced.

THE TRIAL.

WOODSTOCK, Oct. 21—Sandy Monacelli was found guilty of manslaughter this afternoon for slaying of Nicholas Legault, Judge Landry immediately sentenced the prisoner to imprisonment in Duchesne penitentiary.

His Honor, on hearing the verdict, said: "Thank you gentlemen, for your attendance. You are now dismissed until the first Tuesday in December, when the court will finish the business on the docket."

Solicitor General McLeod—I move for sentence at once, as I wish to leave today. I would also ask that a bench warrant be issued against Albert Demerchout for failure to obey a subpoena issued for this trial. His Honor ordered that the bench warrant be issued for Demerchout at the next court, after having been informed that Monacelli could understand English. If spoken slowly, His Honor said:

Well, Sandy, you have been charged with a very serious offence; you have had fair trials, first before the magistrate and now in this court. We have spent some time over your case. Twelve men have found you guilty of manslaughter. Evidently they thought you must have had some provocation or you would not have done the deed. Had they found you guilty of murder, I would have said that there was sufficient evidence to support a verdict of willful murder. They said, instead that it is manslaughter, which they have conscientiously delivered.

"I am going to give you a heavy sentence. It is right that you should be punished. You did not know that you were in danger you should have tried to escape from the window as you did after you committed the deed. You are a fellow man. If you are a good boy and behave well and your friends can convince the government that your sentence should be shortened I will go nothing to oppose the shortening of the sentence. It will be a lesson to you and other foreigners that you must not take life."

I. C. R. NEEDS BRANCH LINES

He Would Have the Branch Lines Lapsed—C. T. Pacific will not Compete With the Intercolonial, says Westmorland M. P.

MONTREAL, Oct. 22—Hon. H. R. Emmerson believes that the I. C. R. can be made profitable in an interview here Wednesday, a portion of which was given out yesterday. Hon. Mr. Emmerson said in reference to the I. C. R. Management Board:—"Of course, the whole ideal is to make the line a commercial success. But there the line never was built for that purpose. It was built as a result of a compact at Confederation, to give transportation to the people of the Maritime Provinces. In Quebec and still more in Ontario, the people have a splendid system of canals which are free to them, and which are maintained at a deficit of a million and a quarter of dollars per annum. The people of the Maritime Provinces have no canals. They have only the railway, and why should there be such an outcry, because the railway, like the canals, does not show a profit?"

"All the same, I believe the I. C. R. can be made profitable, but it will be a policy of expansion, not of contraction. What should be done is to extend the line where necessary and to acquire local lines as feeders."

WHOLE SHIP WAS MASSACRED

VICTORIA, B. C. Oct. 21—Further advice of the massacres in New Britain early last month, briefly reported in Sydney cables, received by the steamer Marama yesterday, show that Captain Lindsay, of the ketch Rabaul and ten of his crew, were murdered and burned and the trading vessel, the ketch Marama, and the bodies of some of the victims being thrown into the flames.

The steamer Lanoeog, which had returned to Sydney from the New Britain group shortly before the Marama sailed, reported the occurrence. Her officers said Captain Lindsay, owner and master of the Rabaul, who was prominent in the New Britain trade, was off the east coast of New Britain, about two hundred miles from Herbyshire, recruiting labor. Captain Lindsay went ashore and was secured by the natives. He and his crew were then dragged out to the beach and burned. The bodies of the crew were scattered on the beach and were completely destroyed.

A German warlike expedition was being prepared when the Lanoeog left the island.

A report was also brought from the island that the French recruiting ketch, the Gaudebeue, was attacked and wrecked by the blacks in New Hebrides at the same time at Mallico, and the French captain and his crew of eight were massacred, but no confirmation had been received of this.
