

If a man owns property in two or three districts he gets two or three tax bills and must hunt up two or three collectors to pay his money to, or be chased around by two or three of them. Extensions of time are given and the corporation borrows money at swift interest to meet its need in the meantime. Waste creeps into the proceedings at both ends. The corporation should keep track of its itizzens and dispense with collectors, making taxes payable at a central point—an intaxes payable at a central point-an in-

exorable obligation upon the individual, same as a matured note in a bank. Those who fail to pay within the dates stipulated should have to pay a per cent. penalty to should have to pay a per cent. penalty to sustained. Collecting taxes is now a heavy burden on those who are taxed, and those who pay with honest promptness flave their noses held to the grindstone by those who pay noth-ing until they are forced to. 
