The greatest reduction in the last item is on of \$15,000 for surveys of townships in new districts. Owing to the absence election expenses, which totalled \$76,000 last year, the miscellaneous account has been reduced this year by \$100,292. The principal increases under the heap of education are \$1100 extra for School Practical Science; \$1250 for mechanics' institutes, art schools, etc.; \$2,400 for departmental' examinations; \$1,800 for miscellaneous expenses.
