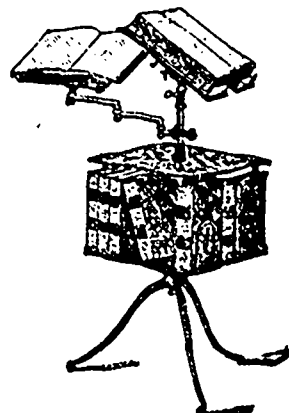


THE LAMBIE DICTIONARY HOLDER & ATTACHMENTS.
