The Rev. A. Milne, M.A., has, we regret to say, been compelled to sover his connection with the PRISBYTERIAN. We urge our co-laborers not to lose time. Our general agent having resigned, we have to depend, to a large extent, on voluntary effort. Our friends can help us if they will. Now is the time for renewing and extending subscriptions. We send specimen copies, propaid, to all who write for them. We are hearing already from active friends, but shall be glad to hear from more. 
