THE UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA, by James Lawler. With photos of the various college buildings in connection with this institution, and also of the leading men connected with each college.


STORIES, by J. Macdonal Oxley and Kathleen Sullivan. Both of these will be profusely illustrated by Canadian artists.
