SALT .- The demand continues slack, and prices remain as last quoted, a few small lots having changed hands at 40c to 421c for elevens and at 35c to 37kc for twelves. Factory filled is quiet at \$1.05 to \$1.10, and Eureka at \$2.40, \$1.20 and 60c for bags, halves and quarters respectively.

WINES AND SPIRITS .- European advices state that the weather in Champagne was very favorable up to the end of July, and that the grapes were then already half-grown. About the middle of July 3,000 hectolitres of wine were sold at Loches at 27 to 28 francs the hecto, and about a week or few days later a large purchase of 400,000 bottles of 1981's was made by one firm. In the South of France the dry weather has favored a good and early vintage, both as regards quantity and quality. A few sales of Alicante have taken place at 34 francs and Majorcas at 19 to 20 f. Advices from Charente regarding brandy state that reports coming in from the interior are very satis-factory, and that, according to the best judges, there will be a good average ordinary yield of

WOOL .- There has been more enquiry for foreign wool, and sales of Uape have transpired at 16¹/₂c up to 18c, as to quantity and quality. A lot of about 400 bales of Cape is on the way to this city, but most of it has been sold to arrive. A cargo of Cape has also arrived in Boston for Montreal destination. There has been some demand for Australian, and sales have taken place at 20c to 23c for Sydney and at 10c to 21c for Adelaide. A firmer market is reported in the United States for domestic wool, which, however, is still relatively 7c to 8c per lb. cheaper than foreign.
