Market Situation and Outlook

- The total import of northern shrimp decreased by 19% from 1989.
- Strong demand for the largest size (2L, or 50-70 pieces with head on per kg) during the first quarter of 1990 resulted in the import of this size in large quantities, which led to a softening of the price.
- The demand was strong for the L- (70-90 pieces per kg) and M-sizes (90-120 pieces per kg) and the quantity imported of these sizes was somewhat smaller than the actual demand.
- The catches of this species were lower in 1990 than in 1989 and there was strong demand in North America and Europe. This is reported to be another reason for the reduction of exports to Japan.
