CANADIAN DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE TO JORDAN

Canadian assistance to Jordan through CIDA's Mission Administered Funds and Special Programs in recent years includes:

- (a) <u>Mission Administered Funds</u>: a total of \$923,335 disbursed since 1980 on a number of projects in the areas of education, health and nutrition, human resource development, and women in development;
- (b) Special Programs: current expenditures for projects undertaken in Cooperation with non-governmental organizations, totalling approximately \$650,000, the most prominent being a water supply project with UNICEF in Al-Deek and Al-Ties, to which CIDA and UNICEF are contributing \$623,438 each.

Canada also contributes to Jordan's development through our financial allocations to various multilateral organizations, including the following:

- (a) UNDP, which has allocated US \$8.25 million for the 1982-86 program period in the following sectors human resource development, education, government infrastructure, agriculture and natural resources;
- (b) UNICEF, which allocated US \$9.93 million in 1985 for child health and social welfare, water and sanitation, education, and women in development activities:
- (c) UNFPA (UN Fund for Population Activities), which allocated US \$600,000 in 1985 for family planning, demographic analysis and research studies, and the promotion and support of population education and communications.
