195. Upon the expiration of the period mentioned in section 194, the Advocate General shall be deemed to have been appointed for the period of one year from the date of the expiration of the period mentioned in section 194.

196. Where, upon the expiry mentioned in section 195, the Advocate General has not been appointed, the Advocate General shall be deemed to have been appointed for the period of one year from the date of the expiry mentioned in section 195.

196. (1) Every person who has been appointed as a Judge of a court shall have a right to continue in office for a period of five years from the date of his appointment to the office.

Section 196  
Judges

(2) The person who has been appointed as a Judge of a court shall be deemed to have been appointed for the period of five years from the date of his appointment to the office.

Judges

(3) Where, upon the expiry mentioned in section 196, the Judge of a court has not been appointed, the Judge of a court shall be deemed to have been appointed for the period of five years from the date of the expiry mentioned in section 196.

Judges

(4) When a Judge of a court has been appointed for a period of five years from the date of his appointment to the office, he shall be deemed to have been appointed for the period of five years from the date of his appointment to the office.
