and on every domestic over 18 years of age, coming to Canada from Holland, Denmark, Russia, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Luxemburg, Norway, Sweden, Finland, and Switzerland, providing the company carries on an active emigration propaganda by advertisements in the public press, publication and distribution of pamphlets and personal canvass in the agricultural districts of the countries named, expending annually thereon not less than \$15,000. No bonus is paid on any immigrant not mentally and physically fit or who is a criminal, or has a criminal record, and any expense incurred in having such persons cared for or deported is to be charged against the account of the company. The payment of bonuses on settlers from Galicia, Bukowinia and Poland, excepting Germans, is limited to 5,000 persons per year. The government makes a grant of £750 a year to the company for special work in Norway, Sweden and Finland, providing the company expends a further sum of £1,000 per year on the same special work. The company has deposited with the government £1,000 as a guarantee of good faith and security for the due fulfilment of their terms of the contract, said amount to bear interest at the rate of 3 per cent per annum.
