2. How many Treaty Indians are on social assistance, either municipal, provincial or DIAND in the cities of (a) Vancouver (b) Prince George (c) Prince Rupert (d) Edmonton (e) Calgary (f) Prince Albert (g) Winnipeg (h) Kenora (i) Saskatoon (j) Toronto?

Mrs. Iona Campagnolo (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development): 1. This information is not available. The department does not record the place of residence of registered Indians who do not live on reserves.

2. The municipalities and provincial governments do not maintain a record of the number of persons who are registered Indians to whom they provide assistance. The department had a social assistance caseload of 456 in Edmonton, 210 in Calgary, 52 in Prince Albert, 150 in Winnipeg and 189 in Saskatoon. We did not have a social assistance caseload in Vancouver, Prince Rupert, Prince George, Kenora or Toronto. In those cities the provincial or municipal departments provided assistance to eligible Indian persons.

2. A request has been made by the superintendent to replace three Tri-ram hull craft which have proved unsuitable for the St. Lawrence river waters and and dangerous to staff due to rough ride. The replacement of these boats has not yet been evaluated.

3. Yes. (a) 3 Grew model SS204 and 1 Grew model SS245, 1 speed barge. (b) The above boats were required for service immediately after delivery and time did not permit painting of the hull with Parks Canada colours. All of the above boats will be painted this coming spring. Arrangements were made with a contractor in Brockville to paint the boats last summer but he did not arrive prior to the inclement weather. 2. Was the building ever occupied or used in any way by the Superintendent of the St. Lawrence Islands National Park and, if so (a) on what dates (b) for what purpose?

3. (a) What is the identity of anyone occupying the permanent residence of the Superintendent at Mallorytown Landing during his absence (b) was any rental paid and, if so, what was the amount and to whom was it paid?

Hon. Judd Buchanan (Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development): 1. Yes. Mr. A. D. Tremblay, Superintendent, St. Lawrence Islands National Park and Mr. J. C. Christakos, Director, Ontario Region, Parks Canada.

2. Yes, the superintendent used the building on a number of occasions as a base for inspection of the island system. At all such times radio contact with his office was maintained. The superintendent also used the building for personal reasons on two occasions, May 24-25 and again on August 2-3. Compensation at normal daily rates in charged on each of these occasions.

3. (a) The permanent residence at Mallorytown has been occupied on a full time basis by the Superintendent of St. Lawrence Islands National Park. (b) Not applicable. (c) Not applicable.
