Dear Mr. Chancellor:-

I am forwarding herewith a copy of a letter which I have received from the Student Christian Association of McGill regarding the Student Teachers for Labrador.

The work which Miss Boswell and her group desire to have done in this area divides into two parts. In the first place there is the work with children. This is really Primary Education and is, properly speaking, a liability of the Province. The Provincial authorities are, as a matter of fact, doing something. They have completed some of the school houses and so provided facilities hitherto lacking.

The group interested is anxious to have a lecturer who will travel up and down the shore visiting not only places where these schools are but other places as well, and giving lectures under the Department of Extra-Mural Relations.

You will note that Mr. Stewart's letter states that the sum of two hundred dollars which you promised is not now required for the purpose for which it was originally asked, namely, the work among children, and suggests that it be applied, ^{whether you} to the salary of this lecturer. Miss Boswell also inquired ^{you} would make a similar provision in future years.
