Dear Sir Arthur, I have talked with Prof. Sugars in regard to Prof. Mackay's course on Negotiable Instruments. Prof. Sugars insists that this course is not too advanced for his students and that those who have taken it have got a great deal out of it. He says that the elementary course on this subject given by Dale Harris is not enough to meet the requirements of the C.A. examinations. Those of his students who are coming up for this examination must have an advanced course. It seems that the questions set on this C.A. examination are quite as difficult as those that regular Law students are expected to answer.
