of our Empire, the insect army destroys at least one-tenth every wear:- Canada in field and fruit crops and in timber loses thirty million sterling annually: Australia loses twenty million. These words were bradeast just a year ago by Sir Walter Morley Fletcher, who, surveying the resources of the Empire and the natural forces of insects, players and disease which continually threaten them, gave as his conviction that "of all the m tions in the world now has so great a need as England of bringing biology into her statecraft".
