effentially differ ; it is exceedingly difficult to determine, in the abstract, the utmost poffible publick good which may be attained in any country; this political problem has been found too difficult for the beft Lawgivers, the ableft Statefmen, and the most confummate Writers and Philosophers; the REPUBLIC of PLATO, the UTOPIA of SIR THOMAS MORE, and the OCEANA of HARRINGTON have all been the reveries of great and excellent men, differing from each other in theory, and none of them reducible to practice: Local interefts and prejudices, ancient laws and habits, various combinations of internal expediency, numerous relations of external interefts and connections, and the great dangers of general innovation, muft, when united, place an infurmountable barrier against fpeculative Politicians .- Men of warm imaginations frequently confound the poffible with the probable, and, having created, by the plaftic powers of Fancy, a new people, in a new country, and in the pure state of Nature, they model them at will, B 2
