Sir William Grey Wilson Says Ultimalely Whole British West Indies Would Join.

Sir William Grey-Wilson, a cousin of E.rl Grey,addressed the Canadian Club Thursday, on the Bahama Islands, of which he has been governor for six yeas. He discussed the possibility of a commercial and political union with Canada, and stated his belief that should Canada accede to the desire of the Bahamas the whole of the rest of the British West Indies would speedily
