AT OSGOODE HALL. A Case Just Settled Which Ought to be Read by All Solicitors Hungry for Jobs.

McKinnon v. Risk was an appeal from the County Judge of York and was finished when the court rose. The plaintiffs alleged that they effected an exchange of properties on behalf of defendant, and ask for a commission.

In the somewhat famous case of Lee v. Lee, the appeal of the plaintiff is dismissed and the appeal of the defendant is allowed. Not only do both parties lose, but the plaintiff is ordered to pay the costs.

Another solicitor, then, on the other side of the street, obtained an order of the County Judge for the payment of the costs of the first action. The order was set aside on appeal.
